PRODUCT FOR CONTROL OF GREENHOUSE WHITE FLY AND CERTAIN APHIDS IN  
CARROTS, LEAFY LETTUCE, SPINACH AND SILVERBEET**

**PERMIT NUMBER – PER10918**

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

## CONDITIONS OF USE

### Products to be used:

COURAZE 200 SC INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 60923)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 200 g/L IMIDACLOPRID as the only active constituent.

NUFARM NUPRID 350SC INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 60587)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 350 g/L IMIDACLOPRID as the only active constituent.

NUFARM NUPRID 700WG INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 65887)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 700 g/kg IMIDACLOPRID as the only active constituent.

### RESTRAINT:

DO NOT use on crops produced hydroponically or in glasshouses and other covered situations.

DO NOT apply an imidacloprid based product or any other group 4A insecticides as a foliar spray after soil application of imidacloprid in that crop.

### Directions for Use:

CARROT	Aphids Including green peach aphid ( <i>Myzus persicae</i> ) carrot aphid ( <i>Cavariella aegopodii</i> ) and fennel aphid ( <i>Hyadaphis coriandri</i> )	<u>200 g/L imidacloprid product</u> 25 mL product / 100 L OR 300 mL product / ha  <u>350 g/L imidacloprid product</u> 15 mL product / 100 L OR 170 mL product / ha  <u>700 g/kg imidacloprid product</u>
LEAFY LETTUCE	Greenhouse whitefly ( <i>Trialeurodes vaporariorum</i> )	7 g product / 100 L OR 72 g product / ha
SILVERBEET AND SPINACH	Greenhouse whitefly ( <i>Trialeurodes vaporariorum</i> ) and Aphids	

### Critical Use Comments:

- Apply as a foliar treatment via calibrated boom sprayer or equivalent equipment when pests first appear.
- Ensure thorough coverage and penetration of the crop. Spray to the point of run-off.
- Apply a maximum one (1) application per crop.
- Refer to *Insecticide Resistance Warning* and *Resistance Management Strategy* for aphids and whiteflies on the product label.

**Withholding Period:**

Harvest: Do not harvest for 7 days after application.

**Jurisdiction:**

All States and Territories, except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their Control-of-Use legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that State.

**Additional Conditions:**

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

*To Avoid Crop Damage*

The sensitivity of the crop to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable to only treat a small area to ascertain the reaction before treating the whole crop.

*Export of treated produce*

Maximum Residue Limits (MRLs) have been established to allow treated produce to be used for human consumption. MRLs have been established for IMIDACLOPRID in CARROT and LEAFY VEGETABLES. MRLs can be found in the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code (MRL Standard) Instrument 2019*. MRLs apply only to produce marketed and consumed in Australia. If treated produce is to be exported, residues must not exceed the limits/tolerances of the importing country.

*Other Matters*

Continued issuance of this permit is subject to the outcomes of the current APVMA review of IMIDACLOPRID. This permit may be impacted by the outcomes of this review.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.
