CASORON G HERBICIDE

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 67.5 g/kg DICHLOBENIL as their only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Situation	Pest	Rate
BUSHLAND, PARKS AND GARDENS.	HORSETAIL (<i>Equisetum</i> spp.)	Apply by direct drop hand spreader at a rate of 18 grams product per square metre.

Critical Use Comments:

- DO NOT apply if heavy rain is forecast.
- Remove existing weeds by hand, dessication or cultivation.
- Spread granules evenly over the soil of the area to be treated and immediately water in after application.

Jurisdiction:

NSW only

Additional Conditions:

Apart from the uses dealt with in this permit users must comply with the instructions on the approved label of the registered product, particularly those instructions relating to protection, precaution, safety directions, first aid and storage and disposal.
