This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. ## CONDITIONS OF USE

### Products to be used:

NATRASOAP INSECTICIDAL SOAP SPRAY (APVMA No. 39752)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 285 g/L POTASSIUM SALTS OF FATTY ACIDS as the only active constituent.

### RESTRAINT:

DO NOT mix with other chemicals including fertilisers unless a trial mix was conducted.

DO NOT use during the hot part of the day.

### Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Glasshouse and hydroponically grown Capsicums, Lettuce and Cucumbers	Greenhouse whitefly ( <i>Trialeurodes vaporariorum</i> ) Silverleaf whitefly ( <i>Bemisia tabaci</i> )	1.5-3 L/100 L

### Critical Use Comments:

- Apply when insects are first noticed.
- Spray insects directly in sufficient water to ensure complete coverage of the target using high pressure with fine droplets. Repeat 5-7 days later or as necessary.
- Always add a vegetable oil based spreader/sticker at the recommended rate before adding water.
- Apply in sufficient water to ensure complete coverage of the target.
- Apply morning and evening when temperatures are cooler - do not use during the hot part of the day.
- Maintain good agitation while spraying.

### Withholding Period:

Not required when used as directed.

### Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories, except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their Control-of-Use legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that State.

### Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

#### *To Avoid Crop Damage*

The sensitivity of the crop to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable to only treat a small area to ascertain the reaction before treating the whole crop.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section
