



**PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF A REGISTERED AGVET CHEMICAL
PRODUCT FOR CONTROL OF MELON THRIPS IN EGGPLANT**

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. SUCCESS NEO JEMVELVA ACTIVE INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 64109).

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 120 g/L SPINETORAM as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Eggplant/aubergine (<i>Solanum melongena</i>)	Melon thrips (<i>Thrips palmi</i>)	400 mL product / ha OR 40 mL product / 100 L

Critical Use Comments:

- DO NOT apply more than 4 applications per season.
- Refer to the use pattern and instructions relevant to use on eggplant on the product label.

Withholding Period:

Harvest: Do not harvest for 1 day after application.

Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories, except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their Control-of-Use legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that state.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.
