DITHANE RAINSHIELD NEO TEC FUNGICIDE (APVMA No. 59688) PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 750 g/kg MANCOZEB as the only active constituent.

IMTRADE MANCOZEB 800 WP FUNGICIDE (APVMA No. 57749)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 800 g/kg MANCOZEB as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Critical Use Comments:

• Apply as per label directions by foliar treatment.

Grazing Withholding Period:

DO NOT graze or cut for stock food for 14 days after application.

Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories, except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their Control-of-Use legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that State.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

Export of treated produce

Maximum Residue Limits (MRLs) have been established to allow treated produce to be used for human and animal consumption. MRLs can be found in the *Agricultural and Veterinary*

Chemicals Code (MRL Standard) Instrument 2019. MRLs apply only to produce marketed and consumed in Australia. If treated produce is to be exported, residues must not exceed the limits/tolerances of the importing country.
