This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

SEMPRA HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 56620)

Containing: 750 g/kg HALOSULFURON-METHYL as the only active constituent.

RESTRAINT:

DO NOT apply if heavy rain is expected within at least 48 hours

Directions for Use:

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply Sempra Herbicide during February – October when Navua Sedge is actively growing and prior to seed set, with minimum re-treatment interval of 10 weeks between consecutive applications.
- Apply a maximum of two (02) foliar applications per year, using ground based calibrated boomsprayer or similar equipment, handgun or knapsack sprayer.
- DO NOT apply more than 2 applications per year.
- DO NOT apply less than 10 weeks after the previous treatment.
- For boomsprayer, apply using flat fan nozzles OR with boomless nozzles using a double overlap spray pattern in at least 400L/ha of water. Ensure spray is delivered using a coarse spray quality.
- For spot spraying using handgun or knapsack sprayer, apply 5.2 g product per 400 square metres (m²); for example, mix 5.2 g product in 100 L water and apply 100 L of the mix per 400m².
- Adjust spray equipment to achieve an even spray pattern to ensure complete and uniform wetting of all foliage. For handgun application, a D5 spray tip nozzle or equivalent with an operating pressure of 200 to 400 kPa is recommended.
- Add Banjo or Supercharge Elite Spray Adjuvant at 1L/100L. Refer Sempra Herbicide label.

Withholding Period:

Grazing: Do not graze or cut treated areas for stock food.

Jurisdiction:

QLD only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

Note: 24 February 2017 - Spot rate amended from 100 square metres to 400 square metres, replace Bonza Spray Adjuvant with Banjo and Supercharge Elite Spray Adjuvant, amend three foliar applications per year to two foliar applications per year, addition for boomsprayer 'flat fan nozzles OR Boomless nozzles using a double overlap

spray pattern in at least 400mL/ha of water. Ensure spray is delivered using a Coarse spray Quality', withholding period amended from 'observe grazing withholding period listed on the product label' to 'DO NOT graze livestock or cut for fodder or forage for ten weeks following application. Observe grazing Withholding period for pasture listed on the product label'. Expiry date extended until 31 March 2022 and permit issued as Version 2.

Note: 27/05/2022 – Restraint added. Condition under Withholding Period changed from 'Do not graze livestock or cut for fodder or forage for ten weeks following application. Observe grazing *Withholding Period* listed on the product label' to 'Do not graze or cut treated areas for stock food'. Additional conditions updated to current standard. Version 2 expired 31/03/2022. Permit expiry extended to 30/06/2027. Permit issued as Version 3 on 29/06/2022.
