**PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF A REGISTERED AGVET CHEMICAL
PRODUCT FOR CONTROL OF VARIOUS MITES IN PEAS**

PERMIT NUMBER – PER80558

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

ACRAMITE MITICIDE (APVMA No. 55264)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 480 g/L BIFENAZATE as the only active constituent.

MAFENTE XTRA MITICIDE (APVMA No. 85120)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 500 g/kg BIFENAZATE as the only active constituent.

IMTRADE MACHINE 900 WG MITICIDE (APVMA No. 92305)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 900 g/kg BIFENAZATE as the only active constituent.

RESTRAINTS:

DO NOT use if rainfall is expected before spray has dried as reduced efficacy may result.

DO NOT apply using spraying equipment carried on the back of the user.

SPRAY DRIFT RESTRAINTS:

Specific definitions for terms used in this section can be found at apvma.gov.au/spraydrift.

DO NOT allow bystanders to come into contact with the spray cloud.

DO NOT apply in a manner that may cause an unacceptable impact to native vegetation, agricultural crops, landscaped gardens and aquaculture production, or cause contamination of plant or livestock commodities, outside the application site from spray drift. Wherever possible, correctly use application equipment designed to reduce spray drift and apply when the wind direction is away from these sensitive areas.

DO NOT apply unless the wind speed is between 3 and 20 kilometres per hour at the application site during the time of application.

DO NOT apply if there are hazardous surface temperature inversion conditions present at the application site during the time of application. Surface temperature inversion conditions exist most evenings 1 to 2 hours before sunset and persist until 1 to 2 hours after sunrise.

DO NOT apply within 50 m (aerial application) or 20 m (ground application) when there are livestock, pasture or any land that is producing feed for livestock downwind from the application area.

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply to point of runoff as soon as mites appear.
- Equipment should be calibrated so that no less than 1000 L of water is applied per hectare.
- DO NOT apply more than 1 application per season.

Withholding Period:

Harvest: DO NOT harvest for 3 days after application.

Grazing: DO NOT graze or cut for stockfeed for 3 days after application.

Grazing: DO NOT send animals for slaughter that have grazed or been fed treated pea vines UNLESS they are first placed on clean feed for 4 days before leaving the farm.

Safety Directions:

480 g/L SC products: Harmful if inhaled. May irritate the eyes. Avoid contact with eyes. Do not inhale spray mist. When opening the container and preparing the product for use and using the prepared spray, wear cotton overalls buttoned to the neck and wrist (or equivalent clothing) and a disposable (mist) face mask covering the mouth and nose. In addition, if applying by low pressure hand wand, wear cotton overalls, over normal clothing, buttoned to the neck and wrist, elbow-length chemical resistant gloves and a disposable (mist) face mask covering mouth and nose. Wash hands after use. After each day's use wash gloves and contaminated clothing.

500 g/kg and 900 g/kg WG products: Follow the safety directions on the product label.

Jurisdiction:

ALL States except Vic and NT.

(Note: Victoria is not included in this permit because their 'control-of-use' legislation means that a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in VIC).

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.

Export of treated produce

Temporary Maximum Residue Limits (TMRLs) have been established to allow treated produce to be used for human or animal consumption. A TMRL has been established for BIFENAZATE in PODDED PEA (YOUNG PODS) [SNOW AND SUGAR SNAP] FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION, and in PEA VINES (GREEN) FOR ANIMAL FODDER. MRLs can be found in the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals (MRL Standard for Residues of Chemical Products) Instrument 2023*. MRLs apply only to produce marketed and consumed in Australia. If treated produce is to be exported, residues must not exceed the limits/tolerances of the importing country.
