

PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF A REGISTERED AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT FOR CONTROL OF TOMATO POTATO PSYLLID IN CERTAIN FRUITING VEGETABLES AND ROOT AND TUBER VEGETABLES

PERMIT NUMBER – PER84757

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

Products to be used:

SUCCESS NEO INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 64109)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 120 g/L SPINETORAM as the only active constituent.

DELEGATE INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 61717)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 250 g/kg SPINETORAM as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Pest	Rate
Tomato Potato Psyllid (Bactericera cockerelli)	120 g / L product 400 mL / ha 250 g / kg product
	200 g/ha Apply with wetter as per label rates.
	Tomato Potato Psyllid

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply as a foliar spray immediately upon discovery of the pest using boom spray.
- Ensure thorough coverage of plants.
- DO NOT make more than four (4) applications per crop with a minimum re-treatment interval of 7-14 days.
- DO NOT apply consecutive applications of Group 4C insecticides.
- DO NOT apply while bees are foraging on the crop to be treated.

Withholding Period:

Harvest: Fruiting vegetables - Do not harvest for 1 day after application.

Root and tuber vegetables - Do not harvest for 3 days after application.

Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories, except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their Control-of-Use legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that State.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

To Avoid Crop Damage

The sensitivity of the crop to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable to only treat a small area to ascertain the reaction before treating the whole crop.
