**PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF A REGISTERED AGVET CHEMICAL
PRODUCT FOR CONTROL OF ALLIGATOR WEED IN TERRESTRIAL SITUATIONS**

PERMIT NUMBER – PER84772

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

AC PYRAMID 250 HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 68921)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 250 g/L IMAZAPYR as the only active constituent.

RESTRAINTS

This permit is issued for the control of terrestrial infestations (including riparian zones) of Alligator weed. DO NOT apply directly to plants in water, water or allow drift onto water. DO NOT spray if rainfall or elevated waterflow are expected within 48 h of application. DO NOT apply within 100 m of an irrigation uptake. Manually remove any weed within this zone.

DO NOT allow spray to drift onto nontarget areas.

Directions for Use:

Situations	Pest	Rate
Known infestations of Alligator weed in <u>terrestrial situations only</u> (including riparian zones).	Alligator weed <i>(Alternanthera philoxeroides)</i>	500 mL/100 L to a maximum of 3 L/ha Plus Hasten or Uptake Spraying oil at 0.5 L/ha

Critical Use Comments:

- Use as a follow up treatment to control remnant weeds after initial control with glyphosate or metsulfuron.
- Apply when weeds are unstressed and actively growing.
- DO NOT apply more than once per annum.
- Apply only as a spot spray at low pressure (less than 250 kPa/2.5 Bar) to produce a coarse to very coarse spray.
- DO NOT spray beyond point of run-off.
- Apply as close as possible to the foliage. A distance of not greater than 30 cm is recommended.
- WARNING: Imazapyr is highly toxic to aquatic plants. Where there are threatened nontarget plant species in close proximity, a spray shield should be used.
- Any unexpected or adverse effects at the spray site should be monitored, recorded and reported to the APVMA and NSW Department of Primary Industries as soon as practical.

Withholding Period:

Not required when used as directed.

Jurisdiction:

NSW only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.
