



PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF AN AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT

PERMIT NUMBER -PER9642

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Product to be used:

SUMI-ALPHA FLEX INSECTICIDE

Containing: 50 g/L esfenvalerate as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Peanuts	Lucerne seed web moth (<i>Etiella behrii</i>)	130 - 300 ml/ha

Critical Use Comments:

Spray only when monitoring indicates a sharp increase in etiella moth activity (from low levels between generation peaks) and when at an economically damaging level. Monitoring should be done every second day. No more than two applications should be necessary.

Aim to control moths prior to egg lay on pods. If control has not been obtained prior to egg lay, apply to larvae whilst small and before boring into pods, and prior to the establishment of web-lined shelters.

Esfenvelerate is harmful to beneficial insects. Avoid applying esfenvelerate to peanuts bordered by other crops where pests are being controlled by predators or parasitoids.

Withholding Period:

DO NOT harvest for 14 days after application

DO NOT graze or cut for stock food for 14 days after application.

Jurisdiction:

NSW, QLD, NT

Additional Conditions:

This permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.

OTHER MATTERS

Residues:

To allow produce from treated plants or animals to be supplied or otherwise made available for human or animal consumption the APVMA has established the following temporary maximum residue limits (TMRLS):

Fenvelerate	Peanut	T0.1 mg/kg
	Peanut oil, crude	T*0.01 mg/kg

The permit holder is required to generate appropriate residue data in australia, during the life of this permit, for submission to the APVMA. Contact the APVMA to ascertain the appropriate type and extent of residue data required to allow this permit to be reissued.

Trade:

If withholding periods are followed, export intervals are not required to manage residues in either peanuts or animals fed on feed from peanut crops, which are destined for international markets.
