This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

GRAZON EXTRA HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 60830)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing; 300 g/L TRICLOPYR present as the BUTOXYETHYL ESTER, 100 g/L

PICLORAM present as the HEXYLOXYPROPYLAMINE SALT and 8 g/L

AMINOPYRALID present as the HEXYLOXYPROPYLAMINE SALT as the only active constituents.

APPARENT WOODY HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 64014)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 300 g/L TRICLOPYR present as the BOTUXYETHYL ESTER and 100 g/L

PICLORAM present as the HEXAYLOXYPROPYLAMINE SALT as the only active

constituents.

GENFARM METSULFURON 600 WG HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 59514)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 600 g/kg METSULFURON-METHYL as the only active constituent.

ROUNDUP BIACTIVE HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 48518)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS APPROVED FOR USE IN AQUATIC SITUATIONS

Containing: 360 g/L GLYPHOSATE present as the ISOPROPYLAMINE SALT as the only active constituent.

RESTRAINT:

DO NOT apply to weeds growing in or over water.

DO NOT broadcast spray over water bodies or allow spray drift onto non-target areas.

DO NOT apply under conditions, or from spraying equipment, that may cause drift onto nearby aquatic areas, susceptible plants/crops, cropping lands or pastures.

DO NOT contaminate streams, rivers or watercourses with chemicals or used chemical containers.

DO NOT use products containing picloram and triclopyr within 5 metres of water bodies.

DO NOT spray metsulfuron-methyl if rainfall or elevated waterflow are expected within 4 hours of application. Stop spraying before the herbicide droplets on the leaves begin to coalesce and run off.

Forests		<u>Triclopyr + Picloram product</u> 350-500 mL/100 L + <u>Metsulfuron-methyl product</u> 10 g/100 L
Riparian areas		<u>Glyphosate product</u> 2 L/100 L + <u>Metsulfuron-methyl product</u> 10 g/100 L

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply as a spot spray only, using suitable application equipment.
- DO NOT apply more than 2 applications per year.
- DO NOT apply less than 60 days after the initial treatment.
- Ensure spray covers all foliage and stems as incomplete application will result in regrowth.
- Uptake Spray Oil or an equivalent wetter must be used at a rate of 500 mL/100 L.

Withholding Period:

Grazing: Not required when used as directed.

Jurisdiction:

NSW and QLD only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.
