

PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF A REGISTERED AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT FOR CONTROL OF MIMOSA BUSH IN PASTURES, ROADSIDES AND RIGHTS OF WAY

PERMIT NUMBER – PER13891

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

GRASLAN HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 41257)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 200 g/kg TEBUTHIURON as the only active constituent.

RESTRAINTS:

DO NOT apply to salt or erosion prone areas.

DO NOT apply within 100 metres of a recognised water course.

DO NOT apply on land with a slope greater than 20 percent (11 degrees).

DO NOT apply under conditions which will cause pellet movement to non-target areas during application.

RETAIN at least 20 percent of the original tree population in wildlife corridors that are at least 100 metres wide. These are essential for shade and protection of livestock and native fauna. Ideally, shelter belts should traverse variable terrain, particularly ridgelines and hill tops as well as water courses, and link other vegetated corridors where possible. FOR LONG TERM VIABILITY retain a minimum of 5 hectares for shade areas, regardless of vegetation type. DO NOT apply on field crops, near desirable trees or shrubs or to areas into which their roots may extend or in locations where the chemical may be washed into contact with their roots as injury or death may occur.

DO NOT apply to land to be put under field crops within 5 years of application.

Directions for Use:

rights of way	(Vachellia farnesiana)	or 20 kg/ha

Critical Use Comments:

- Follow all label instructions and comply with all label requirements. Where the product label contradicts this permit, the permit must be followed.
- Applications can be made at any time of the year. Applications just prior to seasonal rainfall may give the most rapid response.
- Apply by hand. Refer to safety directions below.
- Refer to the Graslan label for additional instructions

Safety Directions:

Harmful if swallowed. Will irritate the eyes. Repeated exposure may cause allergic disorders. Avoid contact with eyes and skin. When opening the container and preparing the product and using the prepared product wear cotton overalls buttoned to the neck and wrist and a washable hat and elbow length gloves. Wash hands after use. After each day's use wash gloves and contaminated clothing.

Protections:

DO NOT allow any roots of desirable plants, trees or ornamentals to contact the product. The product may cause temporary herbicidal symptoms to appear on perennial grasses, including buffel grass, particularly after extended dry periods. Higher rates of application of the product (2g/m2) may kill grasses, particularly native annuals. This effect can be minimised by application when grasses are dormant.

The product may seriously injure desirable forage plants such as pasture legumes and other broadleaf plants. These species may regenerate in subsequent seasons.

Poisonous plants may become more palatable after application of granules and stock should be kept away from these plants until they have died down.

DO NOT contaminate streams, rivers or waterways with the granules or used containers.

Other Limitations:

FOR NATIVE VEGETATION

Use of products under this permit on native vegetation must be done in accordance with STATE and/or LOCAL legislation.

Withholding Period:

Not required when used as directed.

Jurisdiction:

NSW and QLD only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.
