**PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF A REGISTERED AGVET CHEMICAL
PRODUCT FOR CONTROL OF LACE BUGS IN OLIVES**

PERMIT NUMBER – PER14414

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

NATRASOAP INSECTICIDAL SOAP SPRAY (APVMA No. 39752)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 285 g/L POTASSIUM SALTS OF FATTY ACIDS as the only active constituent.

RESTRAINT:

DO NOT mix with other chemicals including fertilisers unless a trial mix was conducted.

DO NOT use during the hot part of the day.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Olives	Lace bug (<i>Froggattia olivina</i>)	1-2 L/100 L

Critical Use Comments:

- Spring is the most effective time to control lace bug. Monitor trees carefully to observe the first nymph instars. This will occur early-September in the northern areas of Australia to early-October in the southern areas.
- For maximum impact, apply foliage spray just prior to the oldest nymphs developing wings.
- Apply a second spray 7 to 10 days after the initial spray to eradicate the next batch of nymphs to emerge from leaf tissue. If nymphs are large in size, the shorter repeat time is recommended. Select the longer repeat time when nymphs are small in size.
- Use sufficient spray volume to completely saturate the underside of leaves where lace bugs congregate. It is important that the spray makes direct contact with the pest.
- Refer to the approved label for instructions on the preparation of the diluent and for other conditions of use.

Withholding Period:

Not required when used as directed.

Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories, except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their Control-of-Use legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that State.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.
