



PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF AN AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT

**TO CONTROL TWO SPOTTED MITE AND EUROPEAN RED SPIDER MITE ON
RUBUS AND RUBUS HYBRIDS**

PERMIT NUMBER - PER14425

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Product to be used:

ACRAMITE MITICIDE (APVMA No. 55264)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 480 g/L BIFENAZATE as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Dewberries (including Boysenberry and Loganberry) Blackberries Raspberries (Red & Black) Cloudberry Youngberry	Two spotted mite (<i>Tetranychus urticae</i>) and European red spider mite (<i>Panonychus citri</i>)	65mL/100L

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply to point of run-off as soon as mites appear using airblast sprayer or equivalent. Complete coverage of all foliage is essential.
- DO NOT apply more than two applications per crop per season, with a minimum interval of 21 days between consecutive applications.
- DO NOT apply sequential applications. A different acaricide should be used between bifenazate applications.
- DO NOT use if rainfall is expected before spray has dried, as reduced efficacy may result.
- Follow all label recommendations and restraints.

Withholding Period:

Harvest: DO NOT harvest for 1 DAY after application.

Grazing: DO NOT allow livestock to graze in treated area for 28 days after application.

Jurisdiction:

ACT, NSW, QLD, SA, TAS, NT, WA only.

(Note: Victoria is not included in this permit because their 'control-of-use' legislation means that a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in VIC).

Additional Conditions:

This permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.

Export of produce:

To allow treated produce to be supplied or otherwise made available for human consumption, temporary Maximum Residue Limits (MRLs) have been established for bifenazate in Blackberries, Cloudberry, Dewberries (including Boysenberry and Loganberry), Raspberries, Red, Black at 7 mg/kg. These MRLs apply only to produce marketed and consumed in Australia. If treated produce is to be exported, due account should be taken of the residue definition and residue limits/import tolerances of importing countries; any residues must not exceed those requirements of the importing country.

TO AVOID CROP DAMAGE:

The sensitivity of some species and varieties of the crops to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable, therefore, to only treat a small number of plants to ascertain their reaction before treating the whole crop.
