PRODUCT FOR AERIAL CONTROL OF OXEYE DAISY IN ENVIRONMETAL AREAS**

**PERMIT NUMBER – PER14832**

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

Staff or contractors employed/contracted by the National Parks and Wildlife Service or agencies/organisations represented on regional weeds advisory committees.

## CONDITIONS OF USE

### Products to be used:

ACP METSULFURON 600 WG HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 87274)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 600 g/kg METSULFURON-METHYL as the only active constituent.

### RESTRAINT:

DO NOT spray if rainfall is expected within 4 hours of application.

### *Spray drift restraints:*

Specific definitions for terms used in these conditions can be found at [Apvma.gov.au/spraydrift](http://Apvma.gov.au/spraydrift)

- DO NOT allow bystanders to come into contact with the spray cloud.
- DO NOT apply in a manner that may cause an unacceptable impact to native vegetation, agricultural crops, landscaped gardens and aquaculture production, or cause contamination of plant or livestock commodities, outside the application site from spray drift. Wherever possible, correctly use application equipment designed to reduce spray drift and apply when the wind direction is away from these sensitive areas.
- DO NOT apply unless the wind speed is between 3 and 20 kilometres per hour at the application site during the time of application.
- DO NOT apply if there are hazardous surface temperature inversion conditions present at the application site during the time of application. Surface temperature inversion conditions exist most evenings one to two hours before sunset and persist until one or two hours after sunrise.
- DO NOT apply with spray droplet smaller than coarse spray droplet size category.

### Directions for Use:

Situation	Weed	Rate
Environmental Areas	Ox-eye daisy ( <i>Leucanthemum vulgare</i> )	1-2 g/10L

### Critical Use Comments:

- Apply in a volume of 50 – 80 L/ha using helicopter boom spray calibrated to deliver a COARSE spray to actively growing plants.
- DO NOT apply more than 2 applications per growing season.
- DO NOT apply less than 3 months after the previous treatment.

Aerial Spraying Guidelines (NPWS 2022) are available to ensure that aerial spraying is undertaken in a manner that provides effective control with negligible damage to the environment.

The guidelines include:

1. A checklist of activities
2. Supporting information to the checklist, and
3. Technical information (i.e. herbicides used, frequently asked questions and answers), requirements for signage and Job Safety Analysis (JSA), Safety Work Method Statement (SWMS) and Pesticide Operation Plan (POP), as well as a list of useful web links.

### Jurisdiction:

NSW only.

**Additional Conditions:**

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.

Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 (POEO) It is an offence to pollute waters under the NSW POEO Act. Pesticide users must ensure that the pesticide does not enter waters either directly or indirectly through spray drift or runoff.

PERSONS applying pesticides by aircraft in NSW must hold a current NSW pilot (pesticide rating) licence and be employed or engaged by the holder of an aircraft (pesticide applicator) licence.
