## CONDITIONS OF USE

### Products to be used:

MOVENTO 240 SC INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 61864)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 240g/L SPIROTETRAMAT as the only active constituent.

### Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Potato, Sweet Potato, Tomato, Capsicum, Chilli, Pepper and Eggplant (Field and protected cropping systems)	Tomato Potato Psyllid ( <i>Bactericera cockerelli</i> )	400 mL/ha or 40mL/100L Plus adjuvant as per product label instructions.

### Critical Use Comments:

- Apply by foliar application using calibrated boom sprayer. Ensure adequate penetration and coverage.
- Apply as per product label instructions for each of the crops listed on this permit.
- The product is most effective on nymphs. If pest pressure is high, an initial knock down application of abamectin or bifenthrin may be required.
- Apply with a minimum re-treatment interval of 7 days.
- DO NOT apply more than 3 treatments per crop.
- DO NOT apply more than 2 consecutive sprays of Spirotetramat before changing to an approved insecticide product from a different chemical (MoA) group.
- Apply in accordance with the Resistance Management Strategy. To avoid the development of resistance, the product should be rotated with other approved insecticides from different chemical (MoA) groups.

### Withholding Period:

Harvest:

Tomato, Capsicum, Chilli, Pepper and Eggplant: Do not harvest for 1 day after application.

Potato and Sweet Potato: Do not harvest for 7 days after application.

### Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories.

### Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.
