This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Product to be used:

AFFIRM INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 51321)

Plus other REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 17 g/L EMAMECTIN present as EMAMECTIN BENZOATE as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop Type	Insect Pest	Application Rate
ADZUKI BEAN MUNG BEAN PIGEON PEA	Bean pod borer (<i>Maruca vitrata</i>)	250 mL product / ha

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply by foliar application. Refer to product label for recommended spray volume for pulses.
- Add a non-ionic surfactant at the recommended label rate.
- Timing is important, as earlier larval stages are easier to control. For best results, apply at or just prior to the anticipated time of egg hatch, as indicated by egg levels or scouting.
- DO NOT apply more than two (2) applications per crop, with a minimum re-treatment interval of 7 days between applications. If further applications are necessary, rotate to another approved product with a different Mode of Action group.
- Highly toxic to bees. DO NOT spray any plants in flower while bees are foraging. Beekeepers must be notified if there is potential for managed bees to be affected by spray. Refer to the 'Protection of Livestock – Bees' statement on the product label.
- DO NOT apply under weather conditions or from spray equipment that may cause spray to drift from the target area. DO NOT apply if wind speed is less than 3km and more than 20km per hour, or under conditions where temperature inversions may occur.
- DO NOT allow entry into treated areas for 12 hours after treatment. When prior entry is necessary, wear cotton overalls buttoned to the neck and wrist and chemical resistant gloves.

Withholding Period:

Harvest: DO NOT harvest for 21 DAYS after application.

Grazing: DO NOT graze or cut for stock food for 14 DAYS after application.

Jurisdiction:

All STATES and TERRITORIES, except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their *Control-of-Use* legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that State.

Additional Conditions:

This permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.
