PRODUCT FOR THE CONTROL OF QUEENSLAND FRUIT FLY IN BLUEBERRIES**

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

DANADIM INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 56454)

Containing: 400 g/L DIMETHOATE (an anti-cholinesterase compound) as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Blueberries	Queensland Fruit Fly (<i>Bactrocera tryoni</i>)	75 mL/100 L water

Restrains:

- DO NOT apply by misting or fogging equipment.
- DO NOT apply with air blast spray equipment unless operators are protected by engineering controls such as enclosed cabs fitted with appropriate air filters.
- DO NOT use open mixing/loading systems for aerial application.
- DO NOT use to control pests that are resistant to organophosphorus insecticides as treatment may be ineffective.
- DO NOT use in home garden.

Critical Use Comments:

- DO NOT exceed a maximum number of 7 applications per crop per season, with a minimum retreatment interval of 21 days between consecutive applications.
- Dangerous to bees. DO NOT spray any plants in flower while bees are actively foraging.
- Product is poisonous if absorbed by skin contact, inhaled or swallowed. Refer to safety directions on the product label.

Re-entry period:

- DO NOT enter treated areas until the spray has dried, unless wearing cotton overalls buttoned to the neck and wrist (or equivalent clothing) and chemical resistant gloves. Clothing must be laundered after each day's use.
- **Glasshouses and other confined areas:** DO NOT re-enter until spray deposits have dried and areas has been thoroughly ventilated.

Withholding Period:

Harvest: DO NOT harvest for 1 day after application.

Jurisdiction:

QLD only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.
