Products to be used: NUFARM AMITROLE T HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 31236) PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS Containing: 250 g/L AMITROLE and 220 g/L AMMONIUM THIOCYANATE as the only active constituents.

RESTRAINT:

DO NOT apply if rain is expected within 6 hours of application.

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply to actively growing, immediately prior to flowering. Respraying will be necessary to destroy any regrowth and seedlings.
- DO NOT apply more than 2 applications per year.
- DO NOT broadcast spray over water or allow spray to drift onto non-target vegetation. Stop spraying before droplets begin to coalesce and run-off.

Jurisdiction:

NSW only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.
